# How to Plan Your Tour

This handy guide will help you and your group through the next steps of arranging your wine tour.



#### 1. Set the Date

Anytime is a great time to go wine tasting. However, weekends and weekends during wedding season in particular are some of the busiest days of the year. Enjoy a more personalized experience on a weekday or during colder months.

### 2. Pick a Spot

Select your pickup and drop-off spot to meet everyone in your party.

### 3. Set a Budget

Transportation costs will vary depending on your group size and the length of the reservation. Tasting fees vary from \$6 to \$20 per person per winery. Be sure to earmark some money for wine and souvenirs.

## 4. Designate a Driver

Consider bringing a designated driver or hire a transportation service to ensure you and your group have fun responsibly. The sooner you reserve transportation the more likely you are to find the right size vehicle on your preferred date. Choosing a company located nearest your pickup location may save on costs.

### 5. Plan your Visits

In general, groups of 6 or more require reservations, which can be made by calling each individual winery. Plan an hour at each winery to allow time to taste, buy wine and take in the scenery. Visit winery Website pages to learn more about what each winery has to offer and to help decide which you would like to visit first.

#### 6. Scope out restaurants nearby

Many of the wineries offer snack items for purchase, but wine travelers with a bigger appetite might prefer lunch or dinner at one of Bucks County's fine dining restaurants. There are plenty of BYOB eateries in nearby New Hope, Newtown, Doylestown, and at Peddler's Village.
